

You stabbed to death

A 25-year-old youth was stabbed to death by an unknown assailant in an area under the Itaunja police station.

The incident came to light around 1:45 am when police control room received information that Satish Yadav of Ganeshpur village under the Parsahiya gram panchayat, had been critically injured in a knife attack.

Police and emergency response teams arrived at the spot and rushed the victim by ambulance to the Community Health Centre in Itaunja. He was later referred to the Trauma Centre at KGMU, where doctors pronounced him dead upon arrival.

Police have sent the body

for a post-mortem examination. Officials stated that further legal action in the case is currently underway.

DCP (North) Amit Anand stated that information was received that Satish Yadav (25) was seriously injured in a knife attack by an unknown person in Ganeshpur village under the Mahiganpur police station around 1:45 am on Monday.

He added that on receiving information, the police reached the spot. The injured Satish was admitted to the KGMU Hospital, where he died during treatment.

He mentioned that a case was being registered upon receiving a complaint from the family members and the body has been sent for post-mortem.

He said that further legal action was underway.

Man attacked during dispute

A 59-year-old man was attacked on the neck with a blade during a dispute in Kakori on Sunday.

The incident took place near a country liquor shop in Itaunja. The injured, identified as Muneshwar Prasad Rawat of Barkatabad village, was rushed to the Kakori Community Health Centre in a critical condition, from where he was referred to the Trauma Centre after primary treatment.

According to the police, Muneshwar had gone to the country liquor shop in Itaunja on Sunday.

Dilip Kumar Pal of Itaunja was also present there at the time. An argument broke out between the two

over some issue.

It alleged that as the dispute escalated, Dilip brought a blade from a nearby barber shop and attacked Muneshwar on the neck, leaving him severely injured.

People present nearby informed the police.

The Kakori police reached the spot and took the injured to the Kakori CHC. Due to his critical condition, doctors referred him to the Trauma Centre. Kakori Station House Officer Satish Chandra Rathore stated that a case of attempt to murder is being registered against the accused based on the complaint of Mahendra, son of Muneshwar.

The accused, Dilip Kumar Pal, has been taken into custody and the police are investigating the motive behind the incident.

Woman's body found near RDSO Colony

The body of a woman was found by the roadside near the RDSO Colony in the Alambagh area around 9 am on Monday. The passerby spotted the body and alerted the police. The police team informed senior officials following which a forensic team inspected the spot. Police are also investigating the angle of murder following a robbery.

ADCP (Central) Jitendra Dubey, who rushed to the spot, stated that the Manak Nagar inspector along with his team arrived at the location. The police took the body into possession and sent it to the mortuary.

Fingerprint marks were found around the woman's neck. Multiple teams have been deployed to establish

her identity. Officials suspect that the woman was murdered elsewhere and her body was dumped at the location. The body was found lying next to a drain wall on the roadside. Based on the constriction marks on her neck, it appears she was strangled before her body was disposed of in a secluded area to conceal the crime. Police are also investigating the angle of murder following a robbery.

Man climbs mobile tower, causes panic

Panic gripped the Hazratganj area on Monday when a man, aged around 30, climbed a mobile tower. On receiving the information, the Hazratganj police rushed to the spot and tried to persuade him for a long time.

The man identified himself as Ankur Singh of Rampur

Janak village in Ayodhya. He stated that his case was linked to the Baba Bazar police station area in Ayodhya and he had reached Lucknow to demand action on his complaint. He alleged that he was assaulted on May 28 and subsequently, cases were registered against him on different dates. According to Ankur, he complained to the police, but his grievance was ignored. Ankur alleged that the police took Rs 5,000 from him and filed cases against him. He showed a complaint letter stored on his mobile phone to the police and people present at the spot.

The man stated that a case was registered on his complaint only after he was given death threats, but the accused was not arrested.

Four killed as Thar overturns

Seven people were killed and 23 injured in separate road accidents in Hapur and Kasganj, four youths were killed, and a teenager sustained injuries when a speeding Thar overturned on the

Ganga Expressway in Hapur, according to police.

The accident occurred at 11:56 pm on Sunday when a Delhi-registered SUV carrying five people from Budaun district was heading towards Delhi. The vehicle overturned five to six times before falling by the roadside. The impact

left the SUV severely damaged. Police rescued the occupants trapped inside the vehicle and took them to the Sikhandia community health centre, where doctors declared four of them dead.

The deceased were identified as Joginder (26), Sukhbir (25), Jaswant (20) and Ravi (20). Three pilgrims were killed and 23 others, including women and children, sustained injuries when a pickup vehicle carrying them collided head-on with a loader truck near Mohanpura village on the Kasganj-Sikhandia Rao road in Kasganj.

Thieves target advocate's locked house

Thieves broke into the locked house of an advocate in the Vishwas Khand area of Gomti Nagar and stole valuables worth approximately Rs 45 lakh. The incident came to light on Monday.

The stolen items include jewellery belonging to the advocate's wife worth Rs 43 lakh along with Rs 2 lakh in cash.

The family members were not at home at the time of the incident and the theft was discovered upon their return on Sunday morning.

On receiving information, the Gomti Nagar police and a forensic team arrived at the scene to collect evidence, discover the footprints of the thieves on the house wall along with broken locks on all doors. In his complaint, the police, victim advocate Ansh Shukla stated that he had gone to Delhi for urgent work on August 22.

His wife, Shiva, went to her maternal home in Sitapur on August 25 for Raksha Bandhan. Around 10:45 pm on August 26, his elder brother Alakh, elder sister Priya Shukla, and

parents also left for Delhi, leaving the house empty.

When the family returned from Delhi on Sunday around 9:20 am, they found the main gate and room locks broken and belongings scattered inside. Mattresses of double bed divans in two rooms were lifted up and thieves had cut open the locker of a wardrobe kept in the prayer room to steal jewellery worth about Rs 43 lakh and Rs 2 lakh in cash.

The elder brother reported the incident to UP-112, Nagar police and forensic team to inspect the location, where they found footprints on the boundary wall and gathered other evidence. The advocate mentioned that he returned home at around 1:30 pm before going to the police station to lodge a complaint.

Gomti Nagar Inspector Brajesh Chandra Tripathi stated that an FIR has been registered based on the victim's complaint. Footage from CCTV cameras installed at a hotel opposite the house and in the surrounding areas is being scanned.

Handbag snatcher held

The Alambagh police arrested an accused for snatching a handbag from a woman travelling in an auto-rickshaw and recovered the stolen items on Monday.

The incident occurred on August 29 when the complainant, Geeta Mahotra, was returning home from her office in an auto-rickshaw. Between Jadamah crossing and Jall crossing an unidentified youth on a black scooter snatched her pink purse from the left side and fled towards Jadamah crossing by taking a U-turn in the wrong direction.

The purse contained cash, ATM cards, a pen drive, a small purse, and keys.

A case under section 304(2) of the BNS was registered at the Alambagh police station. Acting on a tip-off, the police arrested the accused, Ayushman Prajapati.

During interrogation, he confessed to the crime and stated that he had deposited Rs 8,500 from the stolen cash into his bank account. Based on his disclosure, the police recovered the pink purse near the railway lines in the Canning area. Section 317(2) of the BNS was added to the case, the scooter used in the crime was seized under Section 207 of the MV Act, and the Rs 8,500 deposited in the accused's account was placed on hold. After completing legal proceedings, the police presented the accused before the court.

Firecracker factory blast in Kaushambi leaves 24 injured

A massive explosion at a firecracker factory in Kaushambi district on Monday afternoon left around two dozen people injured, while about 15 others were feared trapped inside the premises, officials said. The blast occurred in the Pipri police station area near the Manori power house, following which police, fire brigade and Air Force personnel stationed nearby, launched a joint rescue operation.

Kaushambi District Magistrate Amit Pal said the fire brigade had brought the blaze under control and rescue operations were underway to evacuate those trapped inside the factory.

Five of the injured, who were in serious condition, were rescued from the site and referred to SRN Hospital in Prayagraj for advanced treatment, he said. The blast also damaged nearby structures, with five to six houses located adjacent to the factory collapsing in the impact of the explosion, officials said. The district magistrate said no death had been officially confirmed so far.

Meanwhile in Ghazipur, two boys were killed after a gas cylinder caught fire and subsequently exploded at a house in a village of Ghazipur district on Monday, police said.

The incident took place in Deori village under the

station area and the deceased were identified as Sundaram Yadav (12) and Vishal Sharma (14).

According to police, Sundaram had gone to Vishal's house with his sister

Rekha to deliver milk. The two boys were in the courtyard while Vishal's mother, Meena Devi, was cooking inside the house.

During this time, gas leaked from the cylinder and it caught fire.

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Two youths killed as car hits motorcycle

Two youths were killed when a speeding car hit their motorcycle in the Bithoor police station area last Sunday night.

The seriously injured youths were rushed to a nearby private hospital, where they died during treatment. Family members alleged that the occupants of the car were in an intoxicated state. Rahul Nishad, (27) of Bakarganj in Bithoor, was an outsourcing employee at the municipal corporation. His younger brother, Vishal, said that a distasteful relative
